Organizational Setting

The Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) contributes to the achievement of the 2030 Agenda through the FAO Strategic Framework by supporting the transformation to MORE efficient, inclusive, resilient and sustainable agrifood systems, for *better production, better nutrition, a better environment*, and *a better life*, leaving no one behind.

The Forestry Division (NFO) leads FAO's work in promoting sustainable forest management and providing leadership on the environmental, social and economic dimensions of forestry, including its contributions to poverty reduction and food security and nutrition. It liaises with Member Nations, civil society and the private sector in aspects ranging from development of effective forest policies to forest conservation and management issues and strengthens the role of forests in climate change mitigation and adaptation. The Division also collects, analyses and disseminates information on the world's forest resources and, on the production, trade and consumption of wood and non-wood forest products.

The post is located in the Greening Cities Team, that is responsible for the urban forestry programme of the Division and coordinates the implementation of the FAO Green Cities Initiative in close collaboration with other divisions and offices, such Plant Production and Protection (NSP), Office of Climate Change, Biodiversity and Environment (OCB) and Agrifood Systems and Food Safety Division (ESF).

The post is located in the Forestry Division, NFO at FAO headquarters, Rome, Italy.

Reporting Lines

The Junior Professional Officer (Green Cities) reports to the Forestry Officer (Team Leader Greening Cities).

Technical Focus

Development and implementation of programmes and activities related to urban forestry and urban greening (including urban agriculture and bioeconomy) sector.

Collection and analysis of information, data and statistics and project/meeting services to support programme projects, products and services.

Key Functions

- Collects and analyses relevant technical, social, economic, environmental, institutional and technology related information, data and/or statistics to support the delivery of programme projects as well as products and services.
- Undertakes analysis, provides technical input for plans and reports and edits/revises technical/scientific documents.
- Participates in the development of improved work methods, tools and systems.
- Updates databases and web pages.

- Contributes to networking activities and to the mobilization of FAO partners for the implementation of the Green Cities Initiative.

- Advanced university degree in relevant areas such as urban forestry, urban agriculture, landscape architecture, urban planning or related fields.
- Three years of relevant experience, including experience in sustainable urban development, nature-based solutions and urban greening
- Working knowledge (proficient level C) of English and limited knowledge (intermediate level B) of another FAO official language (Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian or Spanish).
